04. Centrepiece for Thanksgiving (arrangement)
05. Wind Chime, any media
06. Hallowe'en door decoration
07. Hallowe'en trick or treat bag
08. Kitchen shower gift. Items to be handmade
09. Display two scrapbooking pages on the same theme (face to face). Should be displayed in plastic sleeves.
10. Handmade jewellery
11. Bow or other accessory for hair, ready to wear
12. Something new, NOT clothing, made from something old. Identify what was old on the tag.
13. Potpourri sachet
14. Article of plastic canvas
15. Decorated vine wreath
16. Decorated Tile or Glass, no larger than 12"
17. Suncatcher or dream catcher, any media
18. Decorative Clothes/Coat hanger, any media, keep hanger shape.
19. Gift for a man
20. Decorated flower pot, 10" maximum
21. Two complete outfits for fashion doll, doll height 24" maximum (displayed on dolls)
22. Two fridge magnets, each different media
23. Decorated shirt or T-shirt
24. Any stuffed article, excluding cushions
25. A gift for baby, not clothing, shawls, quilts or wood items
26. Handmade Pottery item, no larger than 15"
27. Teddy bear, maximum 20"
28. Wall hanging, ready to hang, not framed
29. A useful article of counted cross stitch, ready to hang
30. Decorated basket, any media
31. Useful article made from recyclable material; name material used
32. Decorative article made from recyclable material; name material used
33. Christmas tree-top decoration
34. Christmas tree skirt
35. Christmas gift bag, made of fabric
36. Christmas wreath
37. Handmade Christmas stocking
38. Two Christmas tree decorations, two different methods, tied loosely together
